This leaflet aims to be a quick guide to the medical services that are available to students in Sheffield. It is important to register before you need medical services as the last thing you want to be doing when you are ill is ringing round and filling in forms. We would strongly advise you to register with a medical practice as soon as you arrive in Sheffield.

DOCTORS

The University has two medical centres. An appointment with a GP should be available within a week of the request being made. Practice nurses are available for the treatment of minor injuries and acute illnesses and to give medical and health advice. Additional services are available, such as complementary medicine, occupational health and physiotherapy. Contact the health centre for more details and for opening times.

Emergency Contraception

If you have had sex without using contraception or your method might have failed **it is vital that you see a doctor as soon as possible.**

Emergency methods available:

- emergency pills can be taken up to 72 hours after sex
- the IUCD (coil), effective up to five days after sex

If it is more than 5 days after sex it may be possible to insert a coil (IUCD) up to day 19 of your cycle

The department of Genito-Urinary medicine is a confidential service providing information, screening, advice and free treatment for sexually transmitted infections. To attend clinic you will need to book an appointment. HELP WITH NHS COSTS

Most students are on low income so they should be entitled to some help with NHS costs, or receive free treatment. However, it is your income and not your student status that qualifies you for help.

You may get help with the cost of charges if at least one of the following applies. You are getting or are included in an award of:

- Income Support, income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Pension Credit Guaranteed Credit
- Working Tax Credit with either Child Tax Credit or a disability element (depending on your income)

You may also get help with the cost of charges due to your age or your personal circumstances - contact the Advice Centre for more info

NHS Low Income Scheme

If none of the above apply and you're on a low income you may be able to get help with costs through the NHS Low Income Scheme. The amount of help you get will depend on the amount of income you have. You'll need to complete **form HC1** available from the Advice Centre, a Jobcentre Plus office or NHS hospital. You may also be able to get an HC1 from your doctor, dentist or optician.

If you have already paid for some treatment, you will need to claim on HC5 form (which you must send together with a completed HC1 form) for a refund within 3 months of paying.
