Success for Paul Greaves of Hallam Trampoline

High Performance Hallam Athlete/Coach Paul Greaves has had the honour of being selected as a Great Britain Coach for both the Senior and Junior Trampoline World Championships. The championships are being held in Metz France between Sunday 7th - Sunday 21st November. Paul is the only coach in the country who has been selected as coach for both Seniors and Juniors and has also made history by being the first ever Trampoline coach from South Yorkshire to be selected for a Senior World Championships.

Snow Sports Competition in Edinburgh

Hallam Snow Sports recently returned from a successful weekend competing in Edinburgh at the British Dry Slope Championships, this is one of only two times during the year that BUCS points are available.
